
About Town:



Kessenich Loom Company's standard foot loom is built of Red Oak with a hand rubbed oil finish. Its reputation has been built on being strong and heavy enough for rug weaving. The loom has easy access to the pin and chain tie-up system. Treadles are hinged at the front and are separated sufficiently to ease treadling actions. Rear hinged treadles are optional. Weaving width 30", 4 Shaft with 6 treadles. Heddles are 12" in length to assure a large shed. Extra space is allowed for storage of unused heddles in Shaft frame to avoid interference with the full weaving width of the loom. The beater bar is extra heavy. A steel pin is used to stabilize leg arms. Loom is collapsible for storage and moving, even while warped.

I have included 3 reeds, 2 lease sticks, Rag Shuttle, extra heddles, loom shelves that attach on each side of the leg arm, matching storage bench, and cardboard for warping. It is a really nice loom.
